


# **Construction Notice**

### NINTH LINE INTERSECTION AND ROAD IMPROVEMENTS

Construction Work: On or after July 29<sup>th</sup> to November 1<sup>st</sup>, 2019



The City of Mississauga will begin intersection improvement and road construction of Ninth Line from Eglinton Avenue to Skyview Street and intersection improvements at Burdette Terrace and Henrietta Way. The work will include curb replacement and curb widening, sidewalk replacement, asphalt paving, traffic signals and line painting.

The purpose of this work is to improve north-south transportation capacity and to construct entrances for the new community centre at Burdette Terrace and Henrietta Way.

## **Road / Pedestrian Restrictions**

- **Ninth Line** will be **reduced to one (1) traffic lane** at times during construction hours. Flag persons will be present to direct traffic during lane reductions.
- Left turns might be restricted
- Temporary sidewalk restrictions will be experienced along Ninth Line
- Driveway access to homes/businesses in the work area will be maintained at all times

#### **Work Details**

- Widening of the east side of Ninth Line from Eglinton Avenue to Skyview Street
- Installation of left turn lanes and traffic signals at Burdette Terrace and Henrietta Way
- Repairing affected areas
- Full restoration of the construction area including sod
- Royal Ready Construction Limited is the contractor

# **What To Expect During Construction**

Impacts	Dust, noise, traffic delays and other inconveniences may be experienced. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. We appreciate your patience and cooperation.		
Work Hours	Work will occur between 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., Monday to Friday. Work after hours and on weekends will be limited and only on an as-needed basis.		
Traffic and Pedestrians	Roads	Ninth Line will be reduced to one (1) lane of traffic at times during construction but will be fully open at peak times and after hours. Flag persons will be present to direct traffic during lane reduction.	
	Sidewalks	Pedestrian access in the area will be maintained at all times. Closures of the sidewalk will be experienced, alternative pedestrian access will be provided.	
Transit Service	Travel times may be affected for routes which travel within the construction area:  • MiWay routes 9 and 35  The temporary relocation of some bus stops may be necessary. For further details please visit the MiWay website ( <a href="www.mississauga.ca/miway">www.mississauga.ca/miway</a> ).		
Parking	There are no impacts to on-street parking. Existing parking by-laws still apply.		
Restoration Works	The construction area will be restored with asphalt and sod. This work will occur once construction has been completed and will be dependent on weather.		
Utility Disruptions	Temporary disruptions to utilities (i.e. gas, hydro, water, telecommunications, cable TV) may be experienced. Efforts will be made to promptly restore service		

Future updates will be provided should there be changes to the project. At the end of the project, the City may ask for your feedback on the completed construction project as we strive to improve how we manage infrastructure construction throughout the City.
